Color Search

Step 1: Have fun looking for different colors in nature. Look for different shades of green, browns or grays. You might find many different yellows, pinks and purples in wildflowers. See how many colors you can find.

Step 2: Take crayons or paint samples (your parents might be able to help with this) and match the colors in nature with the crayon or various paint colors. Instead of taking out your entire box of crayons, you can mark several different crayon colors on a piece of paper and take that outside.







Step 3: You might wonder why flower petals are so many different colors, but leaves are only different shades of green? What do you think the purpose of color is in nature? Do you think insects, birds and squirrels see the same colors as humans?

This is a fun activity you can do at a park, in your own backyard, or even inside your home. How many colors did you find?
