**Mother Nature** isn't finished with a tree when it dies. If a dead tree is still standing it is called a snag. When it ends up on the forest floor it is called a deadfall. The organisms that we call decomposers have already been at work for a very long time.



## **The Decomposers**


Fungi, Bacteria and Invertebrates, are sometimes referred to as the FBI. A wide variety of these organisms are involved in the long, slow process of breaking down organic matter into reusable nutrients that can be used to create new life.



How long does this process take? Some say that it takes a tree as long to decompose as it did to live.
